CANADIAN ARCTIC

The Arctic Archipelago is made up of over 36,000 islands which form a natural barrier between Hudson's Bay and the Arctic Circle. Explore the history or experience the legendary Northwest Passage. Visit Inuit settlements marvel, at formations of sea ice, and enjoy an array of birdlife. Keep an eye out for the majestic polar bear, also known as Nanook in this part of the world.

The Arctic's Top Predator

Polar bears are a powerful symbol of strength and endurance of the Arctic. Beneath all that thick fur, polar bears have black skin and the fur is also translucent and only appears white because it reflects visible light. Polar bears can also swim for long distances for many hours to get from one piece of ice to another, with large paws adapted for swimming.

GREENLAND

A trip to Greenland takes you to one of the planet's last great wildernesses, a remote land of ice and snow. With otherworldly landscapes and a beguiling mix of Viking history and contemporary Inuit culture, Greenland offers you an unforgettable and unique adventure.

The Northern Lights – Aurora Borealis

Caused by a collision between the sun's electrically charged particles and the Earth's atmosphere, these dazzling light shows of green, blue and yellow are a true bucket-list experience to treasure.

The Northwest Passage

Greenland Culture

Meaning "Big- House Dwellers" in the local dialect, *Iltoqqortoormiit* is considered one of the most remote communities in the western hemisphere. Home to only 450 residents, it is always a privilege to be welcomed into the community when we visit.

ICELAND

Strewn with volcanoes and ice, Iceland is sometimes called the "Land of Fire and Ice". It is also dotted with natural wonders such as the Blue Lagoon and Dettifoss Waterfall; and offers a rich cultural history.

Birdlife

Over 200 species of birds arrive in the Arctic during the spring and summer months to breed and feed. The steep-sided cliffs found on many of the islands in the North Atlantic and Arctic - including the Faroe Islands, Iceland, the Svalbard archipelago and in Northern Norway - provide the perfect perches for colonies that can number in the millions. Enjoy the spectacle that is the 'hustle and bustle' of colonies of murres or guillemots, razorbills, kittiwakes, little auks and puffins.
